Comprehension

- To retell stories related to events through acting and role play

Word Reading

- To consolidate Phase 2 sounds learnt so far and learn: ss, h, b, f, ff, l, ll
- To begin to recognise the first set of Phase 3 sounds/digraphs from ELS: j, v, w, x, y, z, qu, ch, sh, th, ng, nk, ai, ee, igh, oa
- To learn and recognise the tricky words: into, he, she, we, me, be was, her, my, you
- To know how to blend sounds to read words using the sounds I have been taught
- To know how to spot words with digraphs in them

Writing

- To know how to copy the letters in my name
- To attempt to write words and captions and be able to tell an adult what I have written (linked to Drawing Club)
- Be confident in writing identifiable shapes and letters
- Use the correct language of the Six Moves from Kinetic Letters to begin to form letter taught letters correctly
- To know that each spoken word when written is separated by a space.



Religious Education- Christmas

- To know what makes Christmas special to Christians
- To know what happens in the Christmas story
- To know why Christmas is important and how the church celebrates it
- To know how you feel when celebrating a special time such as Christmas or a birthday

- To know how to subitise 3 and 4
- To develop my counting skills, knowing that the last numbers tells me 'how many'; to know that each thing must be counted once and once only; to know that anything can be counted, including sounds and actions
- To know how to compare sets of objects by matching
- To know the language of 'whole' when talking about objects which have parts

Shape, Space and Measure White Rose Maths-

- To know properties of circles, triangles and squares
- To know how to identify these shapes in everyday life and in the classroom
- To know how to recognise and create AB patterns and begin to develop more complex patterns

Understanding of the World

Past and Present Bonfire Night and Guy Fawkes


- Know that Bonfire Night happens on 5th November
- Know that we celebrate this event on this day because we remember when Guy Fawkes tried to blow up the houses of parliament and King James I a long time ago and was caught before he could do it
- Know that we celebrate this by lighting bonfires, burning a 'guy' and setting off fireworks

Know the following firework safety rules:

- 1. Never throw fireworks
- 2. Keep fireworks in a closed box
- 3. Always wear gloves with sparklers
- 4. Keep pets indoors
- 5. Stand well back
- 6. Never go back to a lit firework

Remembrance Sunday

- Know that Remembrance Day is on the 11th November every year
- Know that it is an event that commemorates the end of World War 1,
- Know that we remember the people who have died in wars on Remembrance Sunday
- Know that the poppy is used as a symbol of the day because they grew on the battlefields after World War 1 when many people died over a hundred years ago
- Know that a poppy is a red flower



Know that the red colour of the poppies symbolised the blood spilled in the war

The Natural World

- Know that the months of September, October and November are in the season of Autumn
- Know that Autumn is one of the 4 seasons which comes after Summer and before Winter
- Know that in Autumn, the temperature cools down and the hours of daylight get shorter
- Know that some trees shed their leaves and other don't
- Know that animals like squirrels begin to store food including nuts for winter
- Know that animals hibernate during Autumn and Winter
