New Academic Year Reminders

As you may be aware, we have several pupils within our school community who suffer from severe nut allergies. Exposure to nuts, even in small amounts, can have life-threatening consequences for these individuals. Therefore, we kindly request your support in ensuring that **no nut-based products** are brought onto the school premises.



Please take a moment to **review the medication your child requires in school** i.e. Inhalers, creams etc and make sure it has not expired. In addition, if there have been any changes to your child's prescribed medication, it is crucial that you inform us immediately. By completing a new medical form at our school office.



To ensure the safety of your child, we kindly request that you notify your child's class teacher or the school office whenever someone different is going to collect your child from school. We kindly request that you provide a password for the adult who will be collecting your child via the School Office or Class Dojo. This password will serve as an additional safeguard, ensuring that only authorised individuals can pick up your child from school.



Both the pedestrian and vehicle gates will be kept shut throughout the school day and parents/carers and visitors can access the school site by using the intercom system which is linked to our school office. The vehicle access gate will automatically lock between the times set out below. Any vehicles that have entered the site prior to these times will be required to wait until this automatic lock setting is inactive.



The times the gates will be automatically locked are: 8:40am - 9:00am and 3:10pm - 3:30pm




A Warm Welcome

Dear Parents/Carers,

If your child is eligible for 'free school meals' and you register them for this, we'll receive extra funding called 'pupil premium'. We use this extra money to improve the educational provision and resources at our school.

What is pupil premium funding?

Pupil premium funding from the government is given to schools to help pupils reach their full potential, regardless of their background or financial situation. It's provided for pupils who:

- Are registered for free school meals
- Have been registered for free school meals at any point in the past 6 years
- Are, or have been, in care
- Have parents in the armed forces

At The Redeemer Church of England Primary School, we get an extra £1,455 (figures are for the 2023/2024 financial year) for every eligible pupil who is registered for free school meals. This extra money could make a real difference to the quality of education we offer.

For example, we've previously used pupil premium funding for:

- Educational provision/resources
- Academic interventions
- School Trips/Visitors
- ICT Equipment and Subscriptions
- Wellbeing and self-esteem building interventions

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Is my child eligible for free school meals?

Your child might be eligible if you access:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

Universal infant free school meals

Currently, pupils in reception, year 1 and year 2 are entitled to a free school meal thanks to a different government funding scheme known as universal infant free school meals (UIFSM). You shouldn't confuse UIFSM with free school meals and the pupil premium.

If your child is in reception, year 1 or year 2 and is eligible for free school meals according to the criteria above, you should still register because we'll receive the extra pupil premium funding.

Does my child have to eat the free school meals?

No. Pupils who are registered for free school meals don't have to eat them. If you're eligible but you want your child to have packed lunches you should still register because the school will receive the funding which can support your child in other ways.

How do I register?

You only need to register once at the school.
